The “Terme di San Pellegrino” stop is inserted in a context of marked Art Nouveau qualification next to the Grand Hotel and opposite the Casino, and is configured as a symbolic point of arrival of the Valle Brembana Railway which, at the beginning of the century, continued its journey as far as San Giovanni Bianco.

The building, used only for passenger service, differs from the others built along the line both for an unprecedented layout and for a decorative and monumental accentuation; equipped with a special waiting room and a wooden canopy covering the platform, it is clearly designed to make waiting for convoys even more comfortable for first-class travellers (nobles and prominent figures from the political, commercial and entrepreneurial worlds who frequented the spa town at the beginning of the century).

Note the circular window and the attic that surmounts it in the central body, which suggest a greater participation of the architect Romolo Squadrelli in the building's design choices compared to the other buildings.

Constructed in the spring of 1906, the Terme stop was further differentiated from the other buildings used only for passenger service on the Brembana railway line by the presence in the side wings of a bar designed to provide a food service and a space for the sale of cigars, books and newspapers.
