The San Pellegrino Terme spa was a complex of Art Nouveau buildings that in the early 1900s was equipped with state-of-the-art medical, plant engineering and organisational facilities that had nothing to envy to other European establishments. Built at the behest of the Società Anonima delle Terme and designed by Engineer Mazzocchi, it was located on Viale delle Terme, now Viale C. Mazzoni. The inauguration took place in July 1901 with the presence of important authorities. The new spa could boast of various sections with different services for customers, in addition to elegant first- and second-class baths. There was no shortage of showers and steam baths, as well as a department for medical gymnastics, electrotherapy, inhalations and carbonic acid baths. To make the stay even more pleasant for those being treated, the spa provided entertainment activities with dance music, bars, and meeting rooms for scientific and cultural events. The water used for thermal cures has been analysed several times over the years since the 1700s, and its properties were recognized by the Ministry of Health in 1992. Its therapeutic action is mainly directed at diseases of the stomach and intestines, liver and biliary tract.
